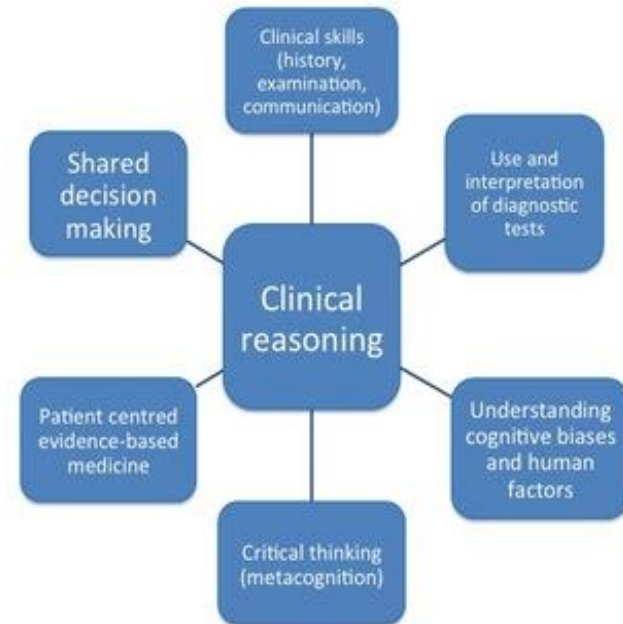

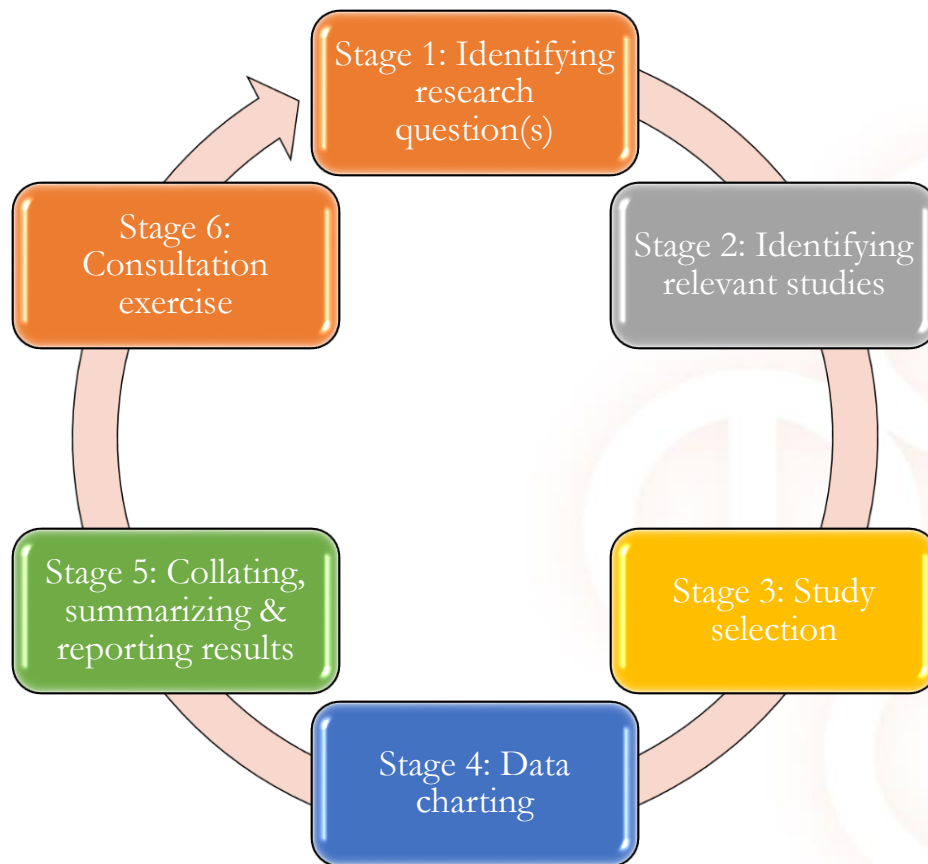


Background: Why this study?

- A plethora of research focusing on clinical reasoning;
- During clinical practice, clinical reasoning is hard to assess;
- During medical school education in Taiwan, few courses explicitly teach clinical reasoning
- During resident training, clinical reasoning is not formally taught
- No systematic review of clinical reasoning research in Asia
